The female trade was strong, the ram trade mixed. There were plenty of customers and quality goods. A large contingent of buyers from far and wide attended with buyers from Scotland, Wales, Northumberland and as far down as Leicestershire. Forward 200 plus.

Highlights of £1250 paid by Jeff Dowey for the Champion Shearling Ram sold by Simon Burford. £900 for 3^{rd} prize Shearling Ram sold by Paul Thorp to Angela Crampton, Grassington.

 2^{nd} prize Shearling Ram sold by Angela Crampton for £600 to Liz Jones of Leicestershire. Shearling Ram from N Belfield sold for £750 to Mrs C Hodgson.

Total clearance of females, top prices 4 Shearling Ewes from Julie Beardwell of £172 to Mr Gilbertson. Shearlings from Angela Crampton of £160 to Camphill of Middlesbrough.

The star point of sale was Angela Crampton's Tup Lamb sold for £580 to Harold Smith of Dunford Bridge. I think this is a record price for a Ram Lamb.

Due to problems with mechanics the sale will have to be at a new venue in 2015. Date and time to follow. Thanks for your support, Paul

Thanks to Julie Beardwell, I can give more detail on the prices achieved at Skipton on 30 August:

Of the nine shearling ewes forward, only one failed to reach £100. Top price was £205, with an average of £136. This was an increase on 2013 prices of £29 (average) and £47 (top price). Jean and Robert Price's ram lamb sold for £210, two of their ewe lambs for £126 and the remaining two for £110. A two shear ewe made £142.
